"He took our infirmities and bore our diseases."

(Matthew 8: 17)

Suffering is one of life's many inevitable aspects. Each religion has dealt with this as a fact. The intensity of our life of suffering is when we speak of death. In the face of suffering, we become powerless and at times we try to find meaning to it. Many people struggle with the burden of loneliness, grief, sadness and depression. Many feel that their life is one long difficult trial. Too many people, young and old, choose to end their lives because they are worn out from carrying heavy burdens, and they see no hope for anything better in the future. That's the agony of life suffering.

In the Christian faith, the attitude towards suffering is guite simply and clearly defined. It is the suffering of Christ that gives meaning to our sufferings. Jesus brings suffering into what we call "a new dimension"- the dimension of love, salvific love. Christ had come as the redeemer and the conqueror of suffering and of death. He does not limit his healing mission to the physical sufferings alone but seeks to heal the whole person.

Sufferings often motivate people to seek God. As they draw closer to Him, they can understand Him better. In the reading this weekend we have Job, that legendary model of long-suffering patience, speaking of the tiresomeness suffering of life. He complains of the hardship he had to experience in life in the face of sudden disasters. He gives expression to the pain and sorrow he is facing. He is unable to see the happiness that lies in store for him. Job feels abandoned by friends and by God when confronted with sufferings, mirroring the dark reflection on the world. The story of Job expresses a typical human problem; that bad things happen to good people and the question of whether people can serve God selflessly, without hope of any

We find Jesus in the Gospel showing himself as a divine friend, who is at work curing the sick. He takes upon his human and spiritual energies to bring healing and wholeness into lives. The healing of Peter's mother-inlaw ends with the scene of crowd of townspeople who gathered outside the house where he was staying, to

bring all the sick people to him. Tainted by physical suffering and by spiritual wretchedness, the crowd begins to find comfort, healing and consolation by his words and actions. He is in the midst of the crowd! He is with the people of brokenness and suffering. It is a humanity marked by suffering, toil and problems. It is to this poor humanity that Jesus' powerful, liberating and renewing action is directed.

Where is God in our suffering? We may not have a fully satisfying explanation for why the world contains so much suffering. But scripture assures us; we have the strength, the power to deal with the suffering. We know where God is during the pain, tribulations and suffering. God is with us. God was with Job in adversity, with Paul in weakness and persecutions and with us in the interior brokenness of our lives.
