PARISH PRIEST SPEAKS

And the Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us, and we saw His glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace & truth. (John 1: 14)

We celebrate the birth of the true Light of the world, "the splendour of the light of Christ which breaks into the darkness". The readings and the reflection of the Christmas season reveal how God's plan for the salvation of the world has unfolded in history and is still coming to its fulfilment. The Gospel of John tells us that this tinv babe lying in a manger before Mary and Joseph is the Word of God, who "became flesh and made His dwelling among us." Now that He is here with us, what can we in turn do to honour His extraordinary act of humility and mercv?

The answer I believe lies by accepting the gift of God, by accepting Christ, accepting the truth of who He is, accepting His Word to us, accepting in faith the wonder that is revealed so simply. It is only when we accept Him, when we "believe in His name," He gives us "power to become children of God." By His birth, which we celebrate on this Christmas Day, we are given hope. God has not abandoned the world. He has not abandoned us in the darkness of sin and death. Rather, He Himself came in person, in Jesus Christ, true God and true man, to unite our humanity with His divinity, to reconcile us with the Father, and to give us the ultimate gift of eternal life.

As we step from the celebration of the incarnate Word, we find ourselves at the home of the Holy Family this Christmas. This weekend, the liturgy invites us to reflect on the experience of Mary, Joseph, and Jesus, united by an immense love and inspired by great trust in God. The Gospel passage this weekend recounts the journey of the family of Nazareth to Jerusalem, for the celebration of Passover. But, on the return journey, the parents realize that their 12-vear-old son is not in the caravan. After three days of searching and fear, they find him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, focused on a discussion with them. At the sight of their son, Mary and Joseph "were astonished" and then Mary revealed their fear to him, saying: "your father and I have been looking for you anxiously". I would like to call your attention to these two words, astonishment, and anxiety.

Being astonished and being amazed is the opposite of taking everything for granted; it is the opposite of interpreting the reality that surrounds us. Being astonished is being open to others, understanding others' reasons, an attitude that is important for mending compromised interpersonal relationships, and healing open wounds. The second element that I would like to grasp from the Gospel is the anxiety that Mary and Joseph felt when they could not find Jesus. That anxiety that they experienced in the three days that Jesus was missing should also be our anxiety when we are distant from him, when we are distant from Jesus. We should feel anxious when we forget Jesus for more than three days, without praying, without reading the Gospel, without feeling the need of his presence and of his comforting friendship. And many times, days pass in which I do not remember Jesus. Let is find ourselves this weekend with these two words: astonishment and anxiety.

Do I know how to be astonished, when I see good things in others, and in this way resolve family problems? Do I feel anxious when I am distant from Jesus?


