Pondering on the Word of God



pening prayer: Heavenly Father, fill me with hope and give me a tangible reminder today that hope is an unbreakable spiritual lifeline (<u>Hebrews 6:19-20</u>). Lord, help me to hear You saying, "I am your hope" over all the other voices that distract and make me stray from You.

You are my hope and refuge when I am miserable, suffering and all alone. Set me free from all evil passions, and cleanse me within, that I may be made fit to love, courageous to suffer, steady to persevere as we read, understand and live Your Word.

Last month, we shared and became more aware of how reading the Bible – God's own real life story - helps us to grow closer and learn more about God and His unconditional love for us. He has so much love for us, that even his suffering, death and sacrifice on the cross is mentioned as the "<u>Passion</u> of the Lord"

In our daily life, we are under various pressure from work, family, marriage, interpersonal relationships, finance and currently the corona virus. We get ourselves in trouble and feel at a loss and even lose hope in life. In this world, where everyone is on the 'fast lane' and relationships and friendships are at times very 'surface', why don't we learn lessons from and find hope and comfort in God's own stories where he too lived with all the challenges of life as a normal man on earth? He set the way for us and it is crucial that we read the Bible to reveal the message of hope and love that he has left us with – Our survival kit!

Our current generation is blessed that technology has advanced and brought God closer with the help of computers, tablets, phones etc. More than ever we need to make time to ponder and to dwell in God's Word.

Meditation is pondering the Word in our hearts, preaching it to our own souls, and personally applying it to our own lives and circumstances. It is how we sanctify our thinking and bring it into submission to Christ—taking every thought captive.

Paul tells us in (Romans 12:2). Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.

Sisters & Brothers in Christ – we do not need to look far for hope and solace – the comfort of the Bible and the verses or tips are there to help us receive faith and strength from God and renew our Hope in life using the path He has set for us. The Word of God has so many answers we seek. When everything seems to fall apart, why not place our hope in our Saviour? He has given us a lifeline if we but only realise it!

This hope is a strong and trustworthy anchor for our souls. It leads us through the curtain into God's inner sanctuary. Jesus has already gone in there for us. He has become our eternal High Priest in the order of <u>Melchizedek</u>

Psalms 77:12

I will **ponder** all your work, And meditate on your mighty deeds

When we read the Bible and ponder on what message is there for us, our hope and believe in God is rekindled. We dwell on it and then as opportunities arise, we preach it to ourselves. We inject it into our thoughts as we make decisions, as we admonish and instruct our souls to choose right things and walk down right paths.

4 steps to ponder on the Word of God:

- 1. **FOCUS**: Quieten our heart ask the Holy Spirit to enlighten, guide and open our heart and mind
- 2. **UNDERSTAND**: Don't read aimlessly select corresponding passages according to our actual problems and difficulties. We can also use the internet to find specific instances where God's Word is a strong affirmation of the hidden message for us
- 3. **APPLY**: Focus on pondering on God's words and understanding the inner meaning repeat words that make an impact and ask why these words stir us.
- 4. **MESSAGE REVEALED**: God's every Word has a message and pondering on His Word will definitely reveal this message to each of us.

Ponder and share:

Hope - *How is your level of hope? *Does it bounce back after being hit?

- *Does it cause you to doubt when you lose hope in a situation eg the current pandemic?
- *Search in the Bible a message of hope that applies to your current predicament

Pope Francis in his message of hope for 2021 said:

"We have a rudder, a hope in the Lord

We have an anchor: by His cross we have been saved. We have a rudder: by His cross we have been redeemed. We have a hope: by His cross we have been healed and embraced so that nothing and no one can separate us from His redeeming love."


Lent is fast approaching with Ash Wednesday on <u>Feb 17th 2021</u>. Why not make a difference this Lent
