Mary is My Mother Too


 The Angle Gabriel announced to Mary She would be God's Mother, you see, And God was conceived by the Holy Ghost, And born of the Virgin Mary.

DIALOGUE

On the morning of 10th May 2017, thousands of pilgrims and faithful from around the world gathered at St. Peter's Square to listen to Pope Francis. In his message that day, the Pope said, "In our catechesis on Christian hope, today we look to Mary, Mother of Hope," In her darkest moment, the death of her son on the cross,



Mary was there "at the crucial moment: when most friends had vanished because of fear."

According to the Pope, Mary, our Mother of Hope teaches us the virtue of waiting, even when everything seems to lack meaning. She is ever confident in the mystery of God, even when He seems to have eclipsed himself due to the evils of the world. In the most difficult moments, Mary does not get depressed before the difficulty of life nor does she protest violently against a hostile fate. "She is instead" said the Pope, "a woman who listens, who welcomes life as it presents itself, with its happy days but also with its tragedies."

The Gospels record Mary's presence at the cross with a simple verb: she was "standing by", she stood by. They said nothing of her reaction: whether she wept or not... nothing is said to describe her anguish and suffering. The Gospel only says she was "standing by". She stood there, at the worst moment, at the cruellest moment, and she suffered with her son. She "stood by".

In conclusion, Pope Francis stated: She is our mother of Hope. In the midst of that community of disciples, so fragile: one had denied, many had fled, all had been afraid, she simply stood by, in the most natural of ways.

May Mary, the mother whom Jesus gave to all of us, always support our steps and may she always say to our hearts: Arise! Look forward, look to the horizon" for I am the Mother of Hope.
