It is a scary prospect that Jesus especially admonishes anyone who is obsessed with the current times in which they live in and do not invest in the things that will lead them to the Kingdom.

Jesus speaks to us in the same way as He did then. He assures us that God knows what many of us go through in moments of shame, suffering and strife because we want to do what is just and right. He feels your sadness and knows every tear that streams down your face. Be assured that Jesus observes as so many turn away from Him in arrogance and pride, believing in themselves alone. The Master watches every move made as people trample over their brethren, cheat and squander with no regret and remorse. **Know that our Lord keeps an account of every good and evil act carried out**. Behold, He also asks us to hold our heads up high as our reward is indeed great is heaven.


