## SCRIPTURE of the DAY

Acts 2: 1-11 Psalm 103: 1, 24, 29-31, 34 Galatians 5: 16-25

John 15: 26-27, 16, 12-15

The next reading is an exhortation by Paul to live the life of the Spirit. If we let the Holy Spirit direct our lives, we will not yield to self-indulgence. Self-indulgence brings about our destruction and we will not inherit the Kingdom of God. The Spirit brings love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. Do we have at least one of these? When we let the Spirit of God lead us and dwell in us, we belong to Jesus. We become the loving children of God, co-heirs to His Kingdom.

This is the Paraclete, the Spirit of Truth, that Jesus promised His disciples, the one who will teach them everything they needed to know and to remind them of everything that He had taught them. The Spirit we receive comes from the Father just as Jesus is from the Father. We are, therefore, enfolded into the mystery of the Holy Trinity, sharing a familial relationship with them.

Empowered by the Holy Spirit, no longer afraid, the disciples spread the Good News to all nations which led to the expansion of the early Church. As we commemorate the International Day of Families, we trust that the Spirit will also empower us in our family life and be united as the Spirit is united with the Father and the Son. And with Pope Francis, we pray to the Holy Spirit to give us strength and courage to bring God's redemptive plan to fruition: Breathe into our hearts so that we may experience the tenderness of the Father, breathe upon the Church so that she may spread the Gospel with joy, breathe upon the world the fresh restoration of hope. 💠
