SCRIPTURE of the DAY

Wisdom 18: 6-9

Psalms 32: 1, 12, 18-20, 22

Hebrew 11: 1-2, 8-19 (or 11: 1-2, 8-12)

Luke 12: 32-48 (or 12: 35-40)

Jesus, in the Gospel reading, urges his disciples to take heart and place their faith in the kingdom of God, where nothing can destroy the treasures that await them. He reminds them that they may be called to account at any time, and like good stewards, should always be ready to welcome the master when he comes.

“Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also”.

These words hold a profound meaning and are a reminder for us today – among the hustle and bustle of our lives, where do our hearts belong? What occupies our thoughts, energies and desires? The things we value reveal what is in our hearts and we are always ready to take action for all that we love.

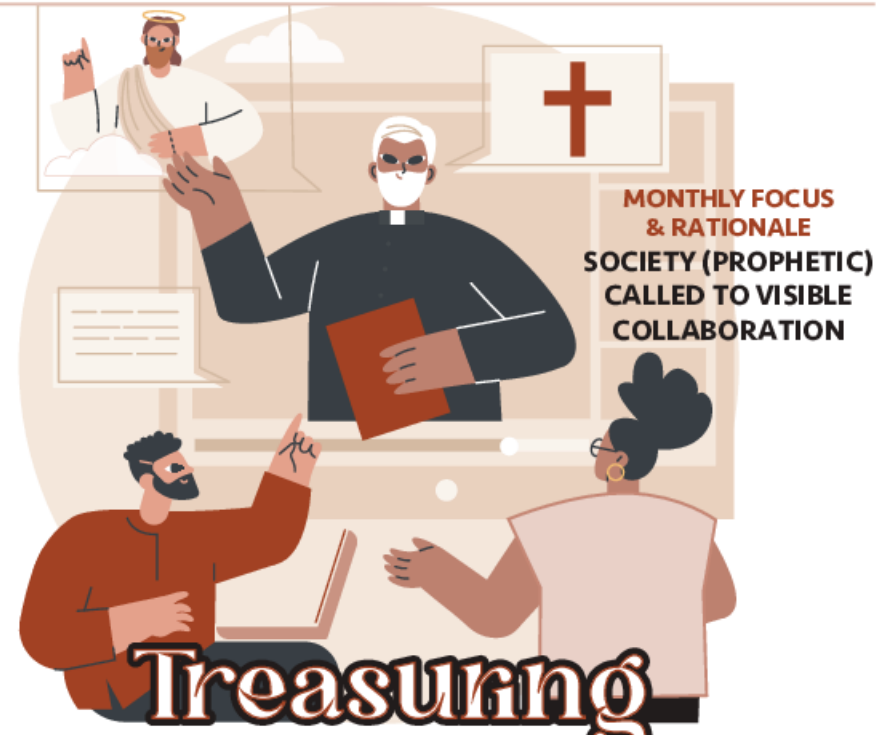
That is why it is so important for us as disciples of Christ to examine the orientation of our hearts.
